



"In the 1920s, the notion was prevalent that **sitting comfortably made for laziness**, and it was not uncommon to be given backless benches.


However, reacting to complaints of **declining productivity and illness**, one company marketed a swivelling chair with a curved backrest that could be adjusted to suit the height of each worker."


